RESUME of BISHOP'S COMMITTEE MEETING - May 15

1. It was agreed to dispose of parts of the old pipe organ to Rev. Mr. Johnson of Good Shepherd. More parts will be sold as buyers express interest.
2. It was agreed to authorize up to \$10 for purchase of various Episcopal pamphlets.
3. Forrest Cole offered to provide a red cedar tree to be planted in front of the former church entrance. A suggestion will be made that the Mabel Payne Memorial provide additional landscaping.
4. An offer by Rex Page to have his sons mow the lawn this summer was gratefully accepted.
5. It was agreed to spend about \$20 for tree trimming, with men of the church to assist in any way possible. Merrill Hunter is to set date.
6. Hunter to also contact Hauser Art Glass in Winona, Minn., for new estimates on stained glass window repair.
7. A house for rent at \$70 per month was discussed. It was agreed that Mr. Richards should be allowed a \$20 monthly utility allowance if he moves into the house. The committee will continue to look for a suitable rectory for purchase.
8. Mr. Richards ordination is now scheduled for June 13 in the evening. A lunch will be served by the Guild, and Guild members from Howard and DeSmet will assist in bringing food. Members of the clergy and any of their congregations interested from Madison, Howard and DeSmet will be invited.
