Mo. Karen opened the meeting with a prayer of General Thanksgiving.

Minutes of the April 28 meeting were approved as read with corrections. Paragraph seven (7) will read "Commission on Ministry" instead of "Commission on Ministries." Paragraph eight (8) will read "the proceeds to be given to the church" instead of "the proceeds to be divided among the church, TEC and ECW." *An additional sentence is added... "The Art in the Park proceeds will be divided among the church, TEC and ECW."* The treasurer's report was also approved as presented.. The bank balance as of May 26 was \$231.49.

There was some discussion on the heating bill, and it was decided to contact Northwestern Public Service about getting the church on a budget payment plan. Ruby will contact them and report back at the June meeting. To date our 1988 heating bill has been \$1074.00.

Under old business, there was no report on microphones and the organ, as Moose was not present.
