Dear Bishop's Committee,  
I am writing about my concern for the problem of restoration or rebuilding of the Church. My desire or wish is to go for the total restoration of the Church. I personally believe, with God's help, that money is available for this type of project, but the problem is to find the source for this money. So I am proposing that a committee of 2 or 3 be formed to look into this matter of searching and recruiting of the money. I would like to be appointed as one of the members to this committee. As you will know we have received \$25 from the escapee contest, I suggest that we use this money to start a special savings account for the restoration and rebuilding fund. I feel that this first step will give the congregation a positive attitude for the long road ahead.  
Another immediate concern is the windows on the north wall (center). The windows is breaking and it must be taken out immediately or it will be lost. The window has already cracked in three places and must be saved.  
Just in passing, I want to remind you that these Church Centennial is next year. You may want to put this topic on a future agenda.
